Joanna Turek – an ethicist, bioethicist, philosopher and educator. With a PhD in Philosophy (dissertation *Klasyczna koncepcja dobra wspólnego a filozofia liberalizmu* [*The classic concept of the common good and the philosophy of liberalism*], 2003), she is a teaching assistant professor and a teaching coordinator at the Department of Bioethics, Medical University of Lodz.

While she specialises in ethics, bioethics and the philosophy of medicine, she greatly enjoys revisiting the history of philosophy and investigating various iterations of the same thematic concerns. Her research focuses on the idea and concepts of justice, specifically on institutional policies that ensure real and equal access to health care.
